

### About Linea 72

Linea 72 was designed by Roland Hirter back in the phototypesetting days, when typefaces were really drawn by hand. It was a static environment, where each work step took its time. With the decision to digitize the typeface, we chose to do it from a today's point of view. That's why the font now includes ten stylistic sets, offering a wide range of opportunities for several glyphs. It comes in the two original styles Regular and Kontur as well as a new Inline style.



